Vermont Schools: Free Statewide Electronics Recycling!

Are you cleaning up from Hurricane Irene and realize that you have a pile of wet electronics? Don't worry! They can still be recycled for free!

Effective July 1, 2011, Vermont's new [electronic waste law](#) bans the disposal of certain electronic devices and provides for convenient collection of computers, monitors, printers, computer peripherals, and televisions for consumers, charities, school districts, and small businesses that employ 10 or fewer individuals.

The FREE Vermont E-Cycles electronic recycling program established collection locations that are located **statewide** and **operate year-round**. All **computers, monitors, printers, computer peripherals and TVs** - regardless of brand, age, or condition - are accepted for FREE recycling. Other electronic devices are also accepted at these locations; however, there may be a fee to dispose of those items.
