

Magazine Flower Pen

How To Do It!

Materials

Colorful magazine pages
Pens
Tape
Green floral tape or duct tape
(optional)

Directions

Rip out pages from an old magazine and cut them in half to make piece that's 8 inches long by 5 inches wide – don't worry about exact measurements as you can make this with any size paper that is longer than wider.

Fold that piece in half to about 8 inches long to 2.5 inches wide. On the folded edge, cut slits $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way down the sheet. Slits can vary but aim for about 1.4 of an inch wide, giving you lots of petals when finished.

Tightly wrap the paper around the top of the pen with the folded, cut side creating the petals (see image).

Tape the bottom to secure the paper and attach to the pen.

Add floral tape or colored duct tape to create the stem (optional).

Then stylize the petals by gently folding them down around the outside.
