Marc Brown (Burke, Vermont) Receives Facilities Staff Recycler of the Year Award

EPSOM, NH 6/6/16– The Northeast Resource Recovery Association (NRRRA), New Hampshire the Beautiful and NRRRA School CLUB presented Marc Brown of Burke Town School in Burke, Vermont with the Facilities Staff Recycler of the Year Award at 7th Annual School Recycling Conference on May 17, 2016 in Nashua, NH.

Marc Brown received the award based on his efforts to maintain high recycling rates in this school, as well as establish many environmentally-friendly initiatives.

Brown's accomplishments include conducting a school-wide recycling training program each fall to incoming students, implementing an energy-efficient pellet stove installation and super-insulating pipes. He monitors the school by using mobile applications that allows him to fix building problems quickly – and remotely, if needed.

"No school recycling program can be successful without the support of the facilities staff," said Michael Durfor, NRRRA Executive Director. "Marc's efforts are not only helping the environment, but saving the school money and resources."

In addition, Marc is dedicated to educating both the students and faculty on what can be recycled. He created a recycling manual as a school resource as well.
